



NEXT STEPS

Congratulations on your admission! Do you know what you should do now to be ready to start at UNT Dallas?

We are here to help! Here are some next steps to complete your enrollment and become a UNT Dallas Trailblazer!

1. **Make sure you have activated your my.UNTDallas.edu account** – By now you should have activated and accessed your **myUNTD** student portal. It is the online gateway to a variety of self-service tools on things like financial aid, scholarships, course registration and your university email, the official means of communication at UNT Dallas. Make sure to log in and check it often!

2. **Register & Attend New Student Orientation (NSO)** – There are several NSO options for incoming students. New Student Orientation sessions are mandatory one-day events that focus on your needs and prepare you to be a UNT Dallas Trailblazer. Registering for NSO is easy! Follow these steps and check out the enclosed handout.
 1. Login to myUNTD at <https://my.untDallas.edu> with your EUID and password.
 2. Click the “Admissions” tile from your Student Homepage.
 3. Click the “Orientation Registration” option located on the left side menu.
 4. Select the NSO session date that fits within your schedule and click “Save”.
Congratulations, you are registered for NSO! Check your email for confirmation notice.
 5. Visit the NSO website <https://admissions.untDallas.edu/new-student-orientation> for more details.

3. **Complete the Financial Aid process** – Make sure you check your FAFSA/TASFA application status, submit any missing financial aid checklist items and accept your awards. Let us know as soon as possible which semester you’re planning on attending UNT Dallas to avoid delays in processing your financial aid award. Completing your Expected Enrollment Form is simple, just follow these steps:
 1. Log into your my.untDallas.edu account
 2. Click the tile labeled “Tasks” from your Student Homepage.
 3. Click “Expected Enrollment for COA” in your “To Do List” items
 4. A box will appear, click “Proceed to Form”.
 5. Make a selection under both the Fall and Spring terms.

Note: Use the chart below to determine your enrollment. Typical courses = 3 credit hours

Number of enrolled courses	Number of enrolled hours	Specific enrollment status
4 or more courses	12 or more	Full-Time
3 courses	9 hours	Three Quarter Time
2 courses	6 hours	Half-Time
1 course	3 hours	Less than Half-Time
0 courses	0 hours	No Enrollment

6. Check the “I certify” box.
7. Verify your responses and click “Submit” in the upper right corner.

4. Most Importantly! When can you pick out your class schedule?

You will get the opportunity to pick out your class schedule during a visit with one of our Academic Success Advisors. Academic Advising for all new students will be completed via your individual advising appointment. UNT Dallas offers new students the opportunity to meet with their Academic Success Advisor prior to attending New Student Orientation. You will still be required to attend NSO, but you will have completed the toughest part! To schedule your TSI Assessment (if needed, see TSI note below) and your individual advising appointment, contact Success Coaching at successcoaching@untdallas.edu (972) 338-1623. Our peer coaches will assist you with scheduling all of your academic services needed.

All first-year and transfer students coming into the University of North Texas at Dallas must have satisfied the TSI (Texas Success Initiative) assessment requirement before setting an appointment with advising and registering for classes. Your registration could possibly be delayed if your TSI status cannot be determined before your orientation session. It is recommended that you wait until after class schedules open for the semester you will be enrolling in before scheduling an appointment with advising. This way, you can see what classes will be offered for the corresponding semester as well as register for those courses.

PLEASE NOTE: You **MUST** register for an orientation session and satisfy your TSI Test requirements **BEFORE** you are able to set an appointment with an academic advisor. Upon registering for an orientation date and satisfying your TSI requirements, you can contact our advising department for assistance with scheduling your appointment using the contact information listed above.

5. **Check out our NEW Residential Living Options** – We are excited to have opened our brand new residence hall and welcome our on-campus residents! For more information on the housing application process, important dates (such as deadlines and move in), please visit the Residence Life page at: <https://housing.untdallas.edu/>
6. **Submit Final Transcripts** – After your final grades are posted and you receive your final high school and dual enrollment transcripts with graduation date(s), submit them to the Office of Admissions. We encourage you to submit these documents before your first day of classes.
7. **Additional Documents and Test Scores** – If you have scores from the AP, CLEP, or IB exams, you might be eligible to receive course credit for your scores. Request that the College Board or International Baccalaureate program send official scores directly to our office, which will arrive electronically directly from the testing agency. Make sure you also send in additional documents requested such as Meningitis immunization records. Check your Task list on your *myUNTD* student portal.
